



U.S. Giving Guidelines

Corporate Giving Program

Ingram Micro's Corporate Giving Program invests volunteer, cash and in-kind support in communities where our associates live and work. These investments are directed to innovative programs to promote education, technology, and economic self-sufficiency, to ensure quality of life and improve the health and well-being of citizens.

The majority of grants are initiated by Ingram Micro and do not stem from unsolicited proposals. While not encouraged, unsolicited proposals are reviewed on an ongoing basis.

Submission Guidelines

Please do not submit hard-copy paper requests. We will only respond to proposals submitted via [e-mail](#).

When submitting a request, include:

- The challenge you wish to address
- The solution you wish to propose
- How Ingram Micro and Ingram Micro volunteers will be included

Organizations requesting support must be:

- Tax-exempt, as designated in Section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Service Code
- Nonsectarian
- Available to the community at large and not restricted to members of the organization
- Able to provide financial statements and operating budget information
- Able to provide a federal tax-identification number

Ingram Micro will consider requests from qualified organizations located in U.S. communities where we operate.

The following are not considered for support:

- Religious or faith based organizations and political organizations are generally excluded for support in an effort to avoid potential conflicts with non-discrimination laws. Ingram Micro is committed to providing an open, diverse, and nondenominational working environment. We will not support any program which requires exposure, adherence to, or conversion to any religious doctrine in order to be a beneficiary of the program. To clarify, a direct service program run by a faith-based organization may be eligible, provided that the program's beneficiaries are not encouraged or required to learn about, adhere to, or convert to that organization's religious doctrine as a condition of receiving service from the program.

Ingram Micro does not discriminate against any person or group with regard to categories protected by applicable law, as well as other categories identified by Ingram Micro in alignment with our own policies. These include but are not limited to gender, race, color, national origin, ancestry, citizenship, religion, age, physical or mental disability, medical condition, sexual orientation, gender identity or gender expression, veteran status, or marital status. We seek to support public benefit organizations that are substantially in alignment with our non-discrimination policy. Organizations that are found to discriminate in their provision of services and/or their hiring practices based on any of these or other relevant criteria may be deemed ineligible for funding consideration and/or required to return any grant awards, and may be rendered ineligible for future support.
